

GERARD SCHWARZ'S ALL-STAR ORCHESTRA CLASSICAL MUSIC TELEVISION SERIES WINS 3rd EMMY® AWARD

Results announced by The New York Chapter of The National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences at the 58th Annual New York Emmy® Awards

May 4, 2015 (New York, NY)—*All-Star Orchestra* took home its 3rd Emmy® Award Saturday at the 58th Annual New York Emmy® Awards, which took place at the Marriott Marquis' Broadway Ballroom in New York City. "*What Makes a Masterpiece,*" a program featuring Beethoven's Symphony No. 5 and Philip Glass' *Harmonium Mountain*, won in the category: **Special Event Coverage (Other than News and Sports)** with John Forsen as Producer, Gerard Schwarz as Music Director, Habib Azar as Director, and Dmitriy Lipay as Audio Engineer. The program is part of the multi-program classical music series featuring top musicians from across the country performing major symphonic masterpieces and works from leading contemporary American composers. The series premiered nationwide on public television and in the New York metro area on THIRTEEN in September 2013.

"What Makes a Masterpiece" was also nominated this year in the category: Audio. In 2014 an earlier program from the All-Star Orchestra series, *"Music for the Theatre,"* featuring music by Stravinsky, Ravel and Bright Sheng, was awarded at the 57th New York Emmy® Awards in two categories: Special Event Coverage (Other than News and Sports) and Audio: Post Production.

Music Director Gerard Schwarz said, "I have such a strong belief in the power and importance of great music, and I care so deeply about making it available to as many people as possible. Our goal is to bring musical masterpieces to life through innovatively filmed performances by outstanding musicians from America's top orchestras. For all of us at the *All-Star Orchestra* receiving these honors are the confirmation of the importance of all of the incredibly hard work, and the affirmation of its impact and reach. We are so grateful to WNET and all of the remarkable public television stations in our vast country for believing in classical music."

Maestro Schwarz's *All-Star Orchestra* is comprised of top players from some of the country's greatest orchestra's including Boston, Chicago, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Dallas, Detroit, Florida, Houston,

Los Angeles, Minnesota, Nashville, New Jersey, New York (the New York Philharmonic and the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra), Oregon, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, San Francisco, Seattle, St Louis, Utah, Washington D.C., and more. Together these musicians perform on one stage under the leadership of Maestro Schwarz, who led the Seattle Symphony for 26 years, and now serves as its Conductor Laureate.

The series features classical masterpieces as well as new works from leading contemporary American composers. The series aims to expose classical music to an even broader audience while keeping the listening experience informative and accessible. In addition to performances of classical and contemporary works, the programs also feature musical excerpts, images, interviews and educational commentary by Maestro Schwarz, the *All-Star Orchestra* musicians, and special guests. The All-Star Orchestra has also launched a music education program in partnership with the **Khan Academy** (<u>www.khanacademy.org</u>), the free educational website that reaches 15 million students and 500,000 teachers each month in 200 countries. The collaboration brings, for the first time, classical music to the already widely visited website that teaches Math, Science, Economics, Humanities and many other subjects.
